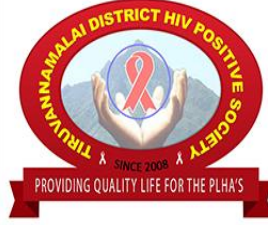

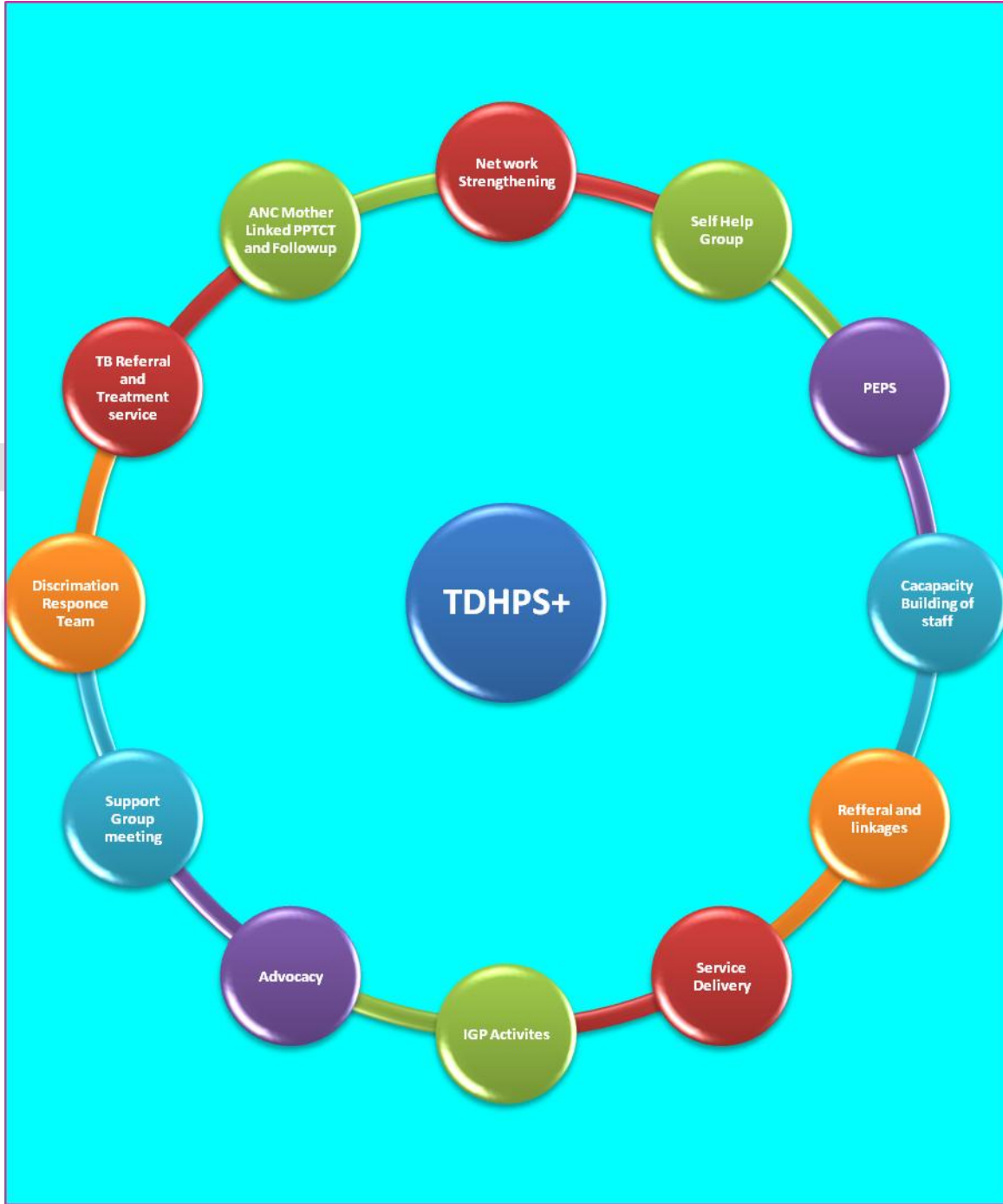

Background of Vihaan project

India revamped care and support strategies in 2013 under NACP IV. Govt. has taken all treatment including OIs and care and support services is taken care by civil society organizations. India HIV/AIDS Alliance became Principle Recipient (PR) for care and support programme. Vihaan (Sanskrit word which means dawn's first light) care and support programme is implemented across India from 2013 onwards. The main goal of the programme is improving quality of life and survival of PLHIV. The programme being implemented with 21 Sub Recipient (SR) partners and 350 CSCs.

The operational guidelines was developed keeping care and support needs in focus and the guidelines developed in consultation with PLHIV community organization, subject experts from various streams and departments. NACO published this guidelines in December 2013. The programme has evolved over the years and certain changes had taken place in its approach and strategies when the programme based on policy changes and changing needs at field level. Moving forward to next phase (2018-2021) furthermore changes expected in view of the roll out of National policy of Test and Treat and also in the pipeline of implementing 'differentiated care model' towards accomplishment of 90:90:90 strategy and changing in funding pattern .Considering the changes in the strategy, approach and service delivery modes, certain changes proposed to care and support in care and support guidelines. Once these changes are accepted, same will be incorporated in guideline document.

Vihaan objectives

Specific objectives of the programme include:

- **Early linkages of PLHIV to Care, Support and Treatment services:** The CSC will support PLHIV who have newly tested positive to enrol into the ART programme.
- **Improved treatment adherence and education for PLHIV:** Adherence education and support can help the PLHIV sustain and manage their treatment regimes. It is essential that all three elements of successful treatment are supported: the client, the provider, and the process.
- **Expanded positive prevention activities:** Improved positive prevention will contribute to the national efforts to prevent HIV transmission and reduce overall burden of disease.
- **Improved social protection and wellbeing of PLHIV:** Social and economic well-being is an important component of care and support. The CSC will facilitate access to the existing social welfare and protection schemes under different line departments, Corporate Sector, Public Sector Undertakings, Faith Based Organisations and civil society organization.
- **Strengthened community systems and reduced stigma and discrimination:** To ensure a robust system that supports the program goal and ensures stigma and discrimination free access to quality services, it is important that skills of the community members to advocate are strengthened. Establishing community systems like community advisory board (CAB) and discrimination response team (DRT) will bring in sustainable response.

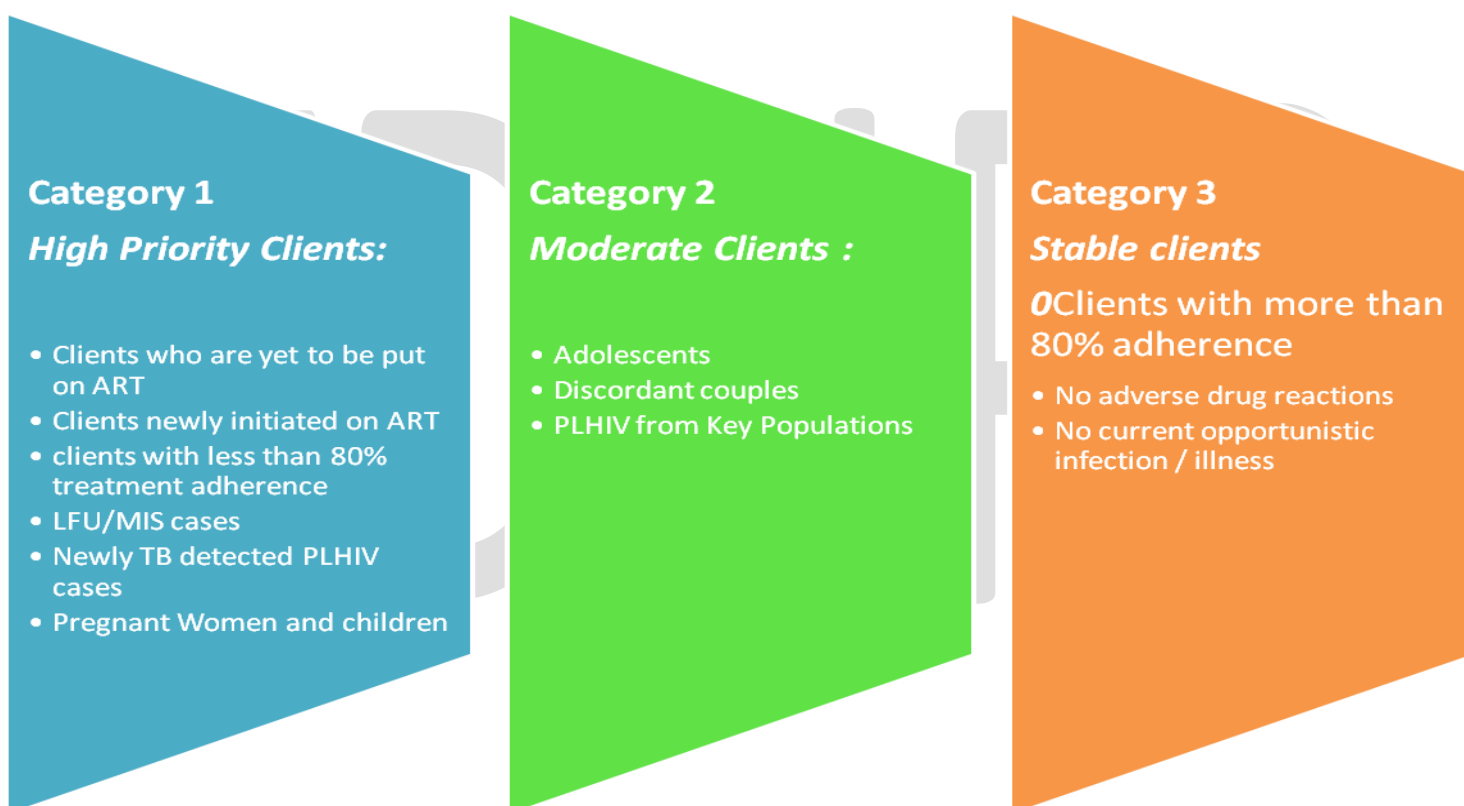
Changes in the Strategy:

Provision of Differentiated Care:

Differentiated care is a client-centred approach that simplifies and adapts **HIV** services across the cascade to reflect the preferences and expectations of various groups of people living with **HIV** (PLHIV) while reducing unnecessary burdens on the health system. By providing differentiated care, also called differentiated service delivery, the health system can reallocate resources to those most in need.

Differentiated care aims to enhance the quality of the client experience. It puts the client at the centre of service delivery. It also ensures the health system functions in both a medically accountable and efficient manner. The central driver to adapting service provision is the client's needs. In line with WHO guidelines, clients are categorized in to 3 major categories based on their clinical characteristics, vulnerabilities, gender, age and socio-economic conditions which are explained below:

Service package:

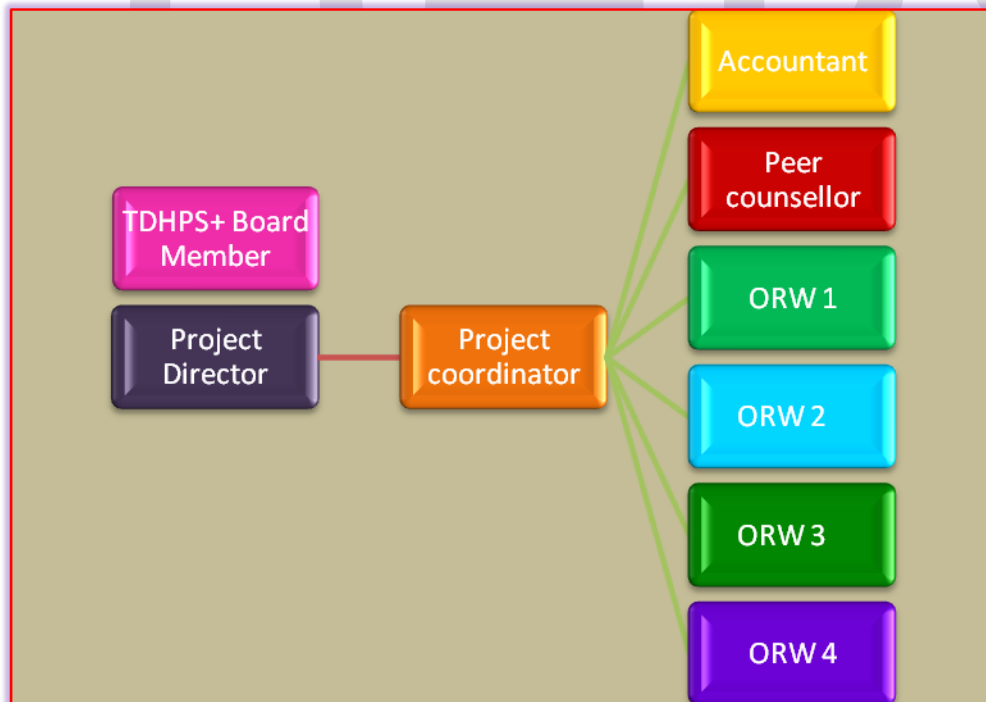


Similar to treatment, care and support requirement of PLHIV is varying and all the clients do not require similar attention. Care and support services should complement the treatment and retention in care.
